SEMINAR ON THE EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OF IALA STANDARDS

INTRODUCTION

The aim of IALA is to foster the safe, economic and efficient movement of vessels, through improvement and harmonisation of marine aids to navigation worldwide and other appropriate means, for the benefit of the maritime community and the protection of the environment.

The goals of the IALA Strategic Vision 2026 is that Marine Aids to Navigation are developed and harmonised through international cooperation and the provision of standards, and that all coastal states contribute to a sustainable and efficient global network of Marine Aids to Navigation through capacity building and the sharing of expertise.

In support of the IALA aim and Strategic Vision, a suite of seven IALA Standards were approved by the General Assembly at its 13th session in Incheon, Korea in 2018. IALA Standards contain Normative and Informative provisions – if a Coastal State wishes to claim compliance with the Standard it is necessary that the IALA Recommendations identified as Normative provisions shall be observed.

This IALA Seminar, delivered with the support of the Directorate General of Coastal Safety of Turkey, is intended to provide information, advice and case studies from a panel of international experts to identify how the IALA Standards may be effectively, appropriately and proportionately implemented in a Coastal State.

OBJECTIVES OF THE SEMINAR

- Explain how to claim compliance with IALA Standards.

- Presentations by international experts on the requirements stemming from the IALA Standards,
- Case studies demonstrating how Coastal States have effectively implemented the Normative Recommendations contained within the IALA Standards,
- Input from the IALA World-Wide Academy on the common issues identified in their Coastal State Analysis related to the implementation of IALA Standards,
- Information on the support available from IALA and the international initiatives being developed to assist Coastal States in the effective implementation of the IALA Standards,
- An opportunity to critically discuss the implementation of IALA Standards.
