The Brazilian Navy, which is the national Maritime Authority, will be pleased to welcome the entire IALA Family and other worthy representatives of the International Maritime Community, at the 20<sup>th</sup> IALA Conference. We will put forth every effort to make this important forum of Global Maritime Industry a successful event, aiming at the improvement of Aids to Navigation and, consequently, raising the level of Safety of Navigation and Environmental Protection worldwide.


By way of background, let me remind you briefly of Brazil's stalwart membership of IALA. Since becoming a member in 1961, Brazil has been a very active and supportive member. In June 1988 they were first elected to the IALA Council and have been consistently re-elected. Rio de Janeiro already welcomed the 26th and 45th sessions of the IALA Council respectively in June 2001 and 2011, and the Industrial Members' Committee in 2019.

More recently, the IALA Heritage Lighthouse of the year 2020 was awarded to Brazil's Santo Antônio da Barra Lighthouse.

It is a pleasure too, to record that the diplomatic representative of Brazil in Paris signed the Convention on the new IALA in October 2021, becoming one of the founding fathers of the new organization.

Of Brazil it is important to recognise that this, the largest country in South America, has huge maritime responsibilities with 7,400 km of coastline, it straddles the Equator with North Atlantic and South Atlantic waters and embraces part of the world's biggest river system, the Amazon basin. Our hosts are responsible for no fewer than 1,626 Fixed Aids to Navigation and 3,156 Floating Aids to Navigation.

In foreground, the Ilha Rasa Lighthouse perched on a "brush stroke of sea", which since 1829 has illuminated the entrance of Guanabara Bay.


