THE COUNCIL

RECALLING

- The function of IALA with respect to Safety of Navigation, the efficiency of maritime transport and the protection of the environment.
- 2 Article 8 of the IALA Constitution regarding the authority, duties and functions of the Council.

NOTING that:

- 1 IALA Recommendation *R0127 (V-127)* on *Operational Procedures for Vessel Traffic Services* provides practices for interactions between the VTS, participating vessels and allied services.
- 2 IALA Guideline *G1089* on *Provision of a VTS* provides practical guidance to assist an authority with delivery of VTS to achieve consistency in provision of VTS worldwide in order to avoid confusion about the delivery of VTS for the mariner trading between various jurisdictions.
- 3 IALA Guideline *G1132* on *VTS Voice Communications and Phraseology* provides guidance for competent authorities, VTS providers and training organizations to develop standardized operating procedures for communications and phraseology and to achieve best practice in effective VTS voice communications.

RECOGNIZING that IALA fosters the safe, economic and efficient movement of vessels through improvement and harmonisation of aids to navigation, including vessel traffic services, world-wide,

- The International Convention on the Safety of Life at Sea 74/78 (SOLAS) Chapter V (Safety of Navigation) Regulation 12 provides for Vessel Traffic Services and states inter-alia that
 - a Vessel Traffic Services (VTS) contribute to safety of life at sea, safety and efficiency of navigation and protection of the marine environment, adjacent shore areas, work sites and offshore installations from possible adverse effects of maritime traffic.
 - b Contracting Governments undertake to arrange for the establishment of VTS where, in their opinion, the volume of traffic or the degree of risk justifies such services.
 - c Contracting Governments planning and implementing VTS shall, wherever possible, follow the guidelines developed by Organization (i.e., IMO Resolution A.1158(32) Guidelines for Vessel Traffic Services.)
- 2 *IMO Resolution A.1158(32)* recognises that:
 - a The level of safety and efficiency in the movement of maritime traffic within an area covered by vessel traffic services is dependent upon close cooperation between those operating the vessel traffic services and participating ships.
 - b The use of differing procedures may cause confusion to ship masters, and that vessel traffic services should be established and operated in a harmonized manner and in accordance with internationally approved guidelines.
- The level of safety and efficiency in the movement of maritime traffic within an area covered by a vessel traffic service would be enhanced by ensuring that VTS communications are



harmonized through common phraseology, procedures and technology for the delivery of precise, simple and unambiguous communications to the bridge team and allied services.

CONSIDERING the proposals of the VTS Committee.

ADOPTS Recommendation R1012 on VTS Communications.

RECOMMENDS that competent authorities and VTS providers contribute to precise and unambiguous communications with the traffic by implementing harmonized and standardized procedures and technology.

INVITES Members and competent authorities for Vessel Traffic Services to implement the provisions of the Recommendation and its associated guidelines on VTS communications.

REQUESTS the Vessel Traffic Services Committee or such other committee as the Council may direct to keep this Recommendation under review and to propose amendments as necessary.
